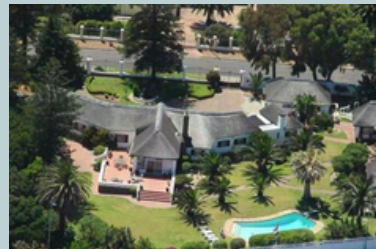

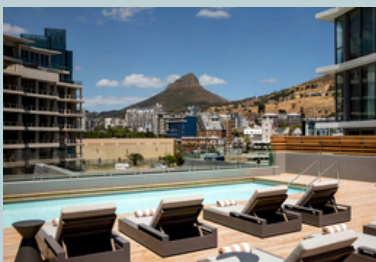

TRANSPORTATION

Upon the arrival in Cape Town, participants are expected to make travel arrangements to and from the respective airports. The following guide will provide the different travel options to Century City Conference Centre.

How to get to the City from the airport ?

- The only way to reach the city center is by taxi/Uber or by hiring a personal chauffeur.
- Approximately 20 km (12 miles) from the airport to the Central Business District and Century City Conference Centre.
- Drive takes 20-30 min normally, 45-60 min during peak hours.
- We recommend that you order an Uber or a Bolt from the airport. Follow the instructions in the app for the location of the Uber/Bolt pick-up area.
- UberX to city centre: R150-R300, generally 20-40% cheaper than metered taxis.

Health Requirement

There are **no mandatory vaccinations** for most travelers; however, if you travel from or through a **yellow fever risk area**, you must present a valid yellow fever vaccination certificate.



Meals

Lunch, tea, and coffee breaks will be provided during the training. If you have **dietary restrictions**, kindly inform us **when completing the registration form**.



Visa Information

Please ensure you meet visa **requirements** for South Africa prior to travel. If you require a **visa support letter**, please contact PILnet. For more information on whether you need a visa, **please visit the South Africa government portal**.



Time Zone

South Africa is GMT+2. The city experiences nearly 14 hours of daylight making it perfect for beach activities and outdoor exploration.



Weather

In Cape Town (in November): Generally warm during the day with cooler evenings. Light layers are recommended.



Food & Water

Tap water in Cape Town is safe to drink. Bottled water is also widely available.



Currency

The local currency is the South African Rand. ATMs and card payments are widely available. It is advisable to carry some cash for smaller purchases.



Power

South Africa uses Type M plugs (230V). A universal adaptor is recommended.

Wi-Fi is available at the airport and most hotels. You can **purchase a local SIM card at the airport** upon arrival (passport required), or arrange an e-SIM before travelling.

SECURITY TIPS

Cape Town is considered generally safe for tourists and business travelers. However, it is important to be mindful of the following:

- Use car-sharing services like Uber or Bolt, and always keep your car doors locked and windows closed.
- Avoid walking after dark: Do not walk around unpopulated areas or deserted beaches at night.
- Stick to busy, well-lit tourist hubs and always take an Uber or Bolt between locations.
- Do not display expensive jewelry, watches, cameras, or large sums of cash. Keep your smartphone secured out of sight when not in use.
- Watch your bags: Never leave phones, wallets, or passports unattended on restaurant tables. Keep your handbag on your lap or securely between your feet, not hanging over a chair.
- ATMs: Only use ATMs located inside well-lit shopping malls or secure bank branches. Never let strangers assist you or distract you during a transaction.
- Never hike alone: Always hike in a group (at least 3-4 people) on official, demarcated trails. Tell someone exactly where you are going and when you expect to return.

Pharmacy & Medical Services

Pharmacies are widely available in Cape Town and stock most common medicines. If you require prescription medication, **please bring enough for the duration of your stay.** Private hospitals and clinics are available should you require medical attention

DATA-RELATED INFORMATION



Wi-Fi & Connectivity

Wi-Fi is available at the airport and most hotels. **You can purchase a local SIM card at the airport** upon arrival (passport required), or arrange an e-SIM before travelling.



Sim Card

- **At the Airport:** Most convenient option right after landing. However, expect to pay a premium for "tourist bundles".
- **In the City (Supermarkets & Carrier Stores):** Buying at a dedicated Vodacom Store, MTN Store, or major supermarkets like Pick n Pay yields much cheaper local rates, but the registration process may take a bit longer.
- **Online (Physical SIM or eSIM):** You can purchase travel SIMs or eSIMs (like via SimCorner) beforehand, ensuring you are connected the moment you land, avoiding the lines. **You will need your passport to register your sim card.**

CULTURE AND ETIQUETTE

WEATHER

November in Cape Town is a summer month, with temperatures ranging approximately from 10°C to 24°C. The weather is warm and pleasant but may rain occasionally. With the huge difference in daytime and nighttime temperature, it is suggested to wear light layers. In daytime, light summer clothes and a sunhat will be useful, but you may need a jumper or jacket for the evenings.

POINTING

Pointing with your index finger is widely considered offensive. To indicate a person or an object, it is more culturally accepted to lift your chin in that direction.

TALKING TO LOCALS

Topics like apartheid, race, or politics may naturally come up in conversation during your time in South Africa. These subjects are deeply personal and can be emotional, so it's always best to approach them with sensitivity and an open mind.

GREETINGS

The most important etiquette point in South Africa is to always greet someone before asking for help or starting a conversation. Skipping small talk and going straight to the point is considered rude.

TIPPING

Tipping is customary in South Africa. The general standard starts at 10% of the bill.

South Africa has 12 official languages:

- English
- Afrikaans
- isiZulu
- isiXhosa
- Sesotho
- Sepedi
- Setswana
- isiNdebele
- siSwati
- shivenda
- Xitsonga
- South African Sign Language

While English dominates business and government discourse, isiZulu and isiXhosa are the most widely spoken first languages.

EXPLORING CAPE TOWN



MUIZENBERG BEACH

Just 30 minutes drive outside of Cape Town, you can explore Muizenberg Beach, recognizable by its colorful Victorian beach huts. It's also the best spot for beginner surf lessons.

V&A WATERFRONT

A bustling hub of shopping, dining, and entertainment. It's home to the Two Oceans Aquarium and the Zeitz MOCAA (the world's largest museum of contemporary African art). Note that we will hold our networking reception in one of the restaurants there.

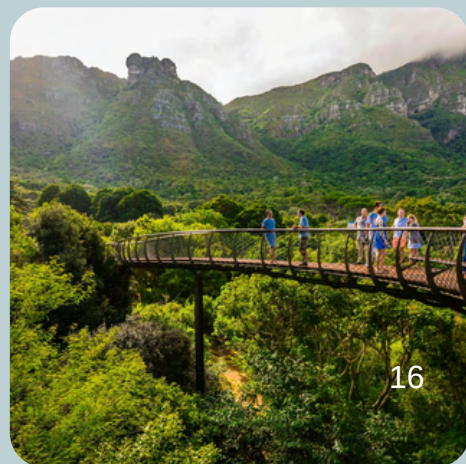


THE OLD BISCUIT MILL

Located in Woodstock, this Saturday market is a foodie's paradise. It's packed with local designers, artisans, and incredible street food.

KIRSTENBOSCH BOTANICAL GARDENS

Nestled on the eastern slopes of Table Mountain, don't miss the "Boomslang" Treetop Walkway for a bird's-eye view of the flora. Note that we will also hold our awards dinner there.



EXPLORING CAPE TOWN

ROBBEN ISLAND

A somber but essential historical site. You'll take a ferry from the V&A Waterfront and tour the prison where Nelson Mandela was held, often guided by former political prisoners.



EXPLORING CAPE TOWN

TABLE MOUNTAIN



Take the Aerial Cableway (revolving floors!). For the best views of the mountain itself, hike Lion's Head at sunrise or sunset (suggest to go in larger groups if you do).

BO-KAAP

Famous for its bright, multicolored houses and cobblestone streets. It's the historic center of Cape Malay culture; consider a cooking class to learn the secrets of a traditional Cape Malay curry.



EXPLORING CAPE TOWN

WHALE WATCHING



From June to November, drive out to Hermanus (about 90 minutes away from city center), known as the best land-based whale-watching spot in the world.

CAPE POINT & CAPE OF GOOD HOPE

Located within a stunning nature reserve at the tip of the peninsula. Look out for ostriches, baboons, and dramatic cliffside views. You can combine this with seeing the penguins on Boulders Beach.



EXPLORING CAPE TOWN



GROOT CONSTANTIA

The oldest wine estate in South Africa, perfect for a history lesson paired with a glass of Pinotage.

WINE TRAM

If you want a social, scenic, and flexible day, this is the gold standard. Franschhoek is about an hour from Cape Town. You board a vintage-style tram or open-air tram-bus that loops through the valley. It's a hop-on, hop-off system. Need to arrange transport to and from the tram station.



STELLENBOSCH

About 45 minutes from the city, Stellenbosch is a historic university town surrounded by over 150 wine farms. Best to arrange as a day tour with driver.
